The Alec Day cup was not awarded since no female novices entered.

The AGM of the 90th NHS was held on Thursday 21/10/21. The accounts showed a surplus with both income and expenditure lower than usual. New Articles of Association were discussed. The originals were devised in 1932 and have not been revised since 1934. The advice of a lawyer has been sought to bring them up to date and these will be available on the members area of the NHS website. Awards for long service to NHS were made to John Hendrie(40yr), Steve Turner(20yr), Becky Champion(15yr) and Enid Brown(10yr).

Following this the National Council met to appoint officers as follows:
